If you would like to see less waste in landfills, want to do your part to protect our environment, reduce your expenses and help yourself and others to become more self sustaining, consider becoming a WSU Lewis County Master Recycler Composter (MRC) volunteer.

WSU Lewis County Master Recycler Composter volunteers learn how to Reduce, Reuse and Recycle then share their knowledge and enthusiasm with others in their local community. WSU Lewis County MRC volunteers make it their mission to provide information to local community members through workshops, composting demonstration sites and educational outreach at the Home and Garden Show and other venues throughout the county.

The WSU Lewis County Master Recycler Composter program is open to anyone with an interest in the three Rs and a willingness to use their knowledge, experience and enthusiasm to make a positive impact on their local community.

Enrollment is open year round!

Attend four basic workshops offered year-round throughout the county, take a tour of the Lewis County Solid Waste Transfer Station and Recycling Center and you are ready to become a certified MRC.

Once you have completed the four workshops and tour, fill out an application, submit a criminal history background check and become a certified WSU Lewis County Master Recycler Composter.

Volunteer Training Requirements

Attend four workshops offered throughout the county:

1. Composting Basics (The Art & Science of Composting)
2. Composting Techniques & Tools
3. Worm Composting
4. Know Your Soils

Tour the Lewis County Solid Waste Transfer Station and Recycling Center

Following completion of the above workshops and tour, complete a WSU Lewis County Volunteer Application and a Criminal History Background Check.

Fee and time commitment: All requirements are free but you must pre-register for some of the workshops. Upon completion of workshops **and** 25 hours of volunteer service, volunteers earn the title of “Certified WSU Lewis County Master Recycler Composter.”

Volunteer service includes, but is not limited to: assisting at public workshops, helping to maintain demonstration sites, staffing booths at various events, attending educational programs, assisting with Christmas tree recycling and Fall Leaf Exchanges.
